. do entertain

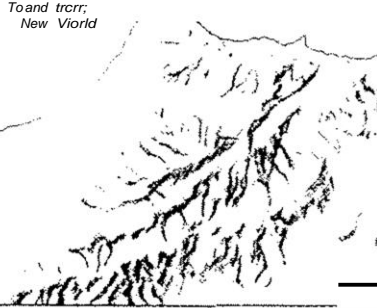
the crowds of goodly folk every day upon the hour(s) of.

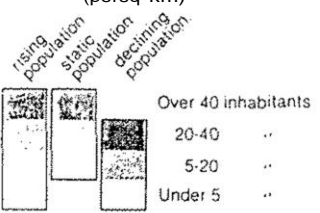

## Domestic uprisings

At the time of the 1066 invasion, the throne of the Kingdom of England was held by the Anglo-Saxons. In the 11th century, the Normans invaded England during the Tudor period. The coronation of King Henry II in 1155, and the coronation of King Richard I in 1189, and the coronation of King John in 1199, were dramatic but never a serious threat. The most important rebellion, the Pilgrimage of Grace in 1536-7, the Kildare revolt of 1534, and the risings of 1549, were extremely shapeless in military terms. Household Heath and Sampford Courtenay in the later years were hardly battle. The Pilgrimage of Grace produced no military engagement, and the majority of the fighting in the Scots war of 1542-51 was on Scottish soil.
